SCRIPTURE John Cox

1 Corinthians 15:1-11

15:1 Now I want you to understand, brothers and sisters, the good news that I pro-

claimed to you, which you in turn received, in which also you stand, 15:2 through which also you are being saved, if you hold firmly to the message that I proclaimed to you-unless you have come to believe in vain. 15:3 For I handed on to you as of first importance what I in turn had received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the

scriptures 15:4 and that he was buried and that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures 15:5 and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. 15:6

Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers and sisters at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died. 15:7 Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. 15:8 Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me.

15:9 For I am the least of the apostles, unfit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted

the church of God. 15:10 But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me has not been in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them, though it was not I but the grace of God that is with me. 15:11 Whether then it was I or they, so we proclaim and so you believed.

Luke 5:1-11

5:1 Once while Jesus was standing beside the Lake of Gennesaret and the crowd was pressing in on him to hear the word of God, 5:2 he saw two boats there at the shore of the lake; the fishermen had gotten out of them and were washing their nets. 5:3 He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little way from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. 5:4 When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch." 5:5 Simon answered, "Master, we have worked all night long but have

finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch." 5:5 Simon answered, "Master, we have worked all night long but have caught nothing. Yet if you say so, I will let down the nets." 5:6 When they had done this, they caught so many fish that their nets were beginning to burst. 5:7 So they signaled their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both boats, so that they began to sink. 5:8 But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus's knees, saying, "Go away from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man!" 5:9 For he and all who were with him were astounded at the catch of fish that they had taken, 5:10 and so

also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who are partners with Simon. Then Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people." **5:11**When they had brought their boats to shore, they left everything and followed him.

Al contrario, he trabajado más que todos ellos, aunque no yo, sino la gracia de Dios conmigo. 15:11 Sea yo o sean ellos, así predicamos, y así habéis creído.

Lucas 5:1-11

5:1 Estaba Jesús de pie junto al lago de Genesaret, y la multitud se agolpaba sobre él para oír la palabra de Dios. **5:2** Vio dos barcas a la orilla del lago; **5:3** Subió a una de las

Y vinieron y llenaron las dos barcas, de tal manera que se hundían. 5:8 Al ver esto, Simón Pedro se arrodilló ante Jesús y le dijo: «¡Apártate de mí, Señor, que soy un hombre pecador!» 5:9 Por la pesca que habían hecho, él y todos los que estaban con él estaban asombrados. 5:10 Lo mismo que Jacobo y Juan, hijos de Zebedeo, compañeros de Simón. Entonces Jesús le dijo a Simón: «No temas; desde ahora serás pescador de hombres». 5:11 Cuando trajeron las barcas a tierra, lo dejaron todo y lo siguieron. llevaron a la cima de la colina sobre la cual estaba construida su ciudad, para arrojarlo por el acantilado. 30 Pero él pasó por en medio de ellos y siguió su camino.
